#### Learning Scripture in Community By Devin Hogg, GCM Alum

This winter I had the great honour to spend some time with the current GCM community. I am currently pursuing a Master's of Theological Studies at Conrad Grebel University College and the University of Waterloo. One of my courses this past semester focused on Teaching the Bible and a key project was to lead a 4-5 week Bible study. I instantly thought of doing so in the community which played such a huge part in my own faith journey. It was through Guelph Campus Ministry that I became Christian as an adult and I was delighted to share my passion for, and knowledge of, scripture with a new generation of students.

Over the course of four sessions, we looked at the Gospel of Matthew, the Epistle to the Romans, the Book of Ecclesiastes, and the Epistle of James. We explored the New Testament's continuity with the Hebrew scriptures, the importance of the wisdom tradition, and the multi-vocality present throughout the Bible. Throughout the sessions, I was impressed by the enthusiastic engagement of the students. They all made me feel very welcome during the Community Dinners that preceded each study session. They also offered keen insights and shared openly across a wide variety of topics.

I deeply appreciated the opportunity to teach and to learn in a community that remains dear to my heart. I was heartened to see the way in which the Spirit continues to bless this ministry on the University of Guelph campus. I am more thankful than ever for the solid foundation that was laid during my own time there as my passion for scripture was encouraged, my unique skills and talents developed, and my leadership ability cultivated. I am excited to see where the next generation of student goes in their own faith journeys.

# Winter Retreat Reflection By Simon Enns, Current GCM Student



# Whole Life Stewardship (AKA "Faithful Adulting") By Sara DeMoor, GCM Campus Minister

At the suggestion of students, GCM organized a few workshops this semester on different topics relating to "adulting," led by GCM alumni or experts from our supporting church communities. Part of GCM's vision is resilient graduates who know that Christ calls them to live faithfully without fear and with hope, stepping into the challenges of their time, and this series of workshops is one way we are equipping students to embody this vision!

We wanted to expand our sense of what faithful "adulting" looks like, so we started out this series with a Faithful Advocacy workshop led by GCM alumnus Conor Russell, who shared his experience and expertise with social and political action and advocacy, both locally and internationally (he recently attended the Eco-School in Greece with the World Council of Churches), and helped us understand the necessity of advocating for justice in concrete ways as followers of Jesus.

The last "adulting" workshop for the semester was a hands-on car maintenance workshop led by Peter Kingma, (recently retired) licensed mechanic and long-time GCM supporter from Water Street CRC. Peter invited us into his 2-bay garage (and into his home for a coffee break), showed us how to change a tire and check tire pressure on one of his vehicles and a students' car, and even created a "cheat sheet" document so we could take notes while he demonstrated! We spent a few hours with Peter, as he patiently showed us how a vehicle works under the hood, made sure we knew what warning lights meant on the dash, and answered all our many questions with kindness and enthusiasm. Students left with a deeper understanding of the complicated insides of a vehicle, and a deep appreciation for Peter and his vocation as a mechanic and mentor.
